Winnipeg is proudly home to many cultures, and the Chinese community has long been an integral and vibrant part of our city’s multicultural fabric. With roots dating back to 1877, generations have contributed to the social, cultural, and economic development of our city. Over the past several decades, as the Chinese population in Winnipeg has grown, so too has the vision and need to revitalize and strengthen Chinatown.

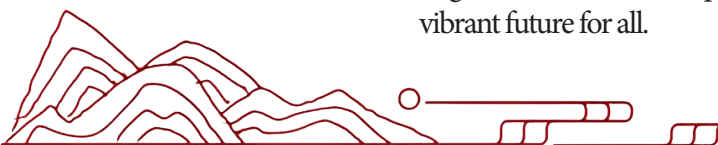
That vision became reality in 1981 through the collaborative support of all three levels of government under the Winnipeg Core Area Initiative, alongside the leadership and commitment of the Chinese community. The Winnipeg Chinatown Development Corporation was established in 1981, and in 1983 the Winnipeg Chinese Cultural and Community Centre was incorporated as a cornerstone of the overall redevelopment project. This initiative responded directly to a 1982 community survey in which 90% of Chinese residents in Winnipeg expressed the need for a cultural and community facility.

Today, under the leadership of WCCCC, we continue to build on that strong foundation. New non-profit and affordable housing developments are underway in the Chinatown area, including the recent groundbreaking of a new affordable housing project at the former Shanghai site — a significant milestone in the continued revitalization of our community.

### Our mission remains clear and purposeful:

- **To provide strong and active leadership** in promoting diversity, inclusiveness, and ethnic harmony — embracing the principle of “no boundaries, no borders, all inclusive.”
- **To serve as a vibrant multicultural hub** where people of all ages, backgrounds, and ethnicities can come together to participate in programs, celebrate culture, and share in our rich cultural mosaic.
- **To promote and preserve Chinese culture and heritage** within the broader Canadian context in ways that are meaningful, relevant, and inspiring.
- **To provide facilities** that support education, cultural exchange, and recreation.
- **To nurture and empower future generations** of young leaders who will carry forward the legacy of the WCCCC.

在当今世界，尽管分歧时有发生，但有一个始终不变信念——团结使我们更加强大。正是人与人之间的联系与合作，凝聚了社区力量，增强了社会韧性，使我们的城市得以持续繁荣发展。

温尼伯是一座以多元文化为傲的城市，而华人社区长期以来一直是这座城市多元文化结构中不可或缺且充满活力的重要组成部分。自1877年以来，一代又一代华人移民在社会、文化及经济发展方面为本市作出了卓越贡献。随着过去数十年温尼伯华人人口的不断增长，振兴与强化唐人街社区的愿景也随之不断发展与深化。

这一愿景在1981年得以实现。当年，在温尼伯核心区发展计划（Winnipeg Core Area Initiative）框架下，联邦、省、市三级政府与华人社区通力合作，共同推动了唐人街复兴项目。在华人社区的领导与积极参与下，\*\*温尼伯唐人街发展公司（Winnipeg Chinatown Development Corporation）\*\*于1981年成立；随后在1983年，\*\*温尼伯中华文化与社区中心（Winnipeg Chinese Cultural and Community Centre）\*\*正式注册成立，成为整体重建项目的核心机构。该项目源自1982年一项社区调查的直接回应——当时90%的温尼伯华人居民表示迫切需要一个文化与社区活动设施。

时至今日，在温城中华文化中心（WCCCC）的领导下，我们持续在这一坚实基础上不断前行。唐人街地区目前正推进多项新的非营利及可负担住房项目，其中包括近期在原“上海”旧址举行的全新可负担住房项目奠基仪式。这一里程碑标志着社区复兴迈出了重要一步。

1. 提供有力且积极的领导，推动多元文化、包容精神与族群和谐的发展，秉持“无界限、无边界、全包容”的理念；
2. 打造充满活力的多元文化交流中心，让不同年龄、背景与族裔的人们能够相聚一堂，参与社区活动、庆祝文化传统，并共同分享丰富多彩的文化成果；

## ■ Organizational Development & Capacity Building

The WCCCC continues to strengthen its operational capacity to effectively serve individuals and families across the city and surrounding regions. Through structured planning, improved coordination, and strengthened internal systems, WCCCC has enhanced its ability to deliver high-quality cultural programming, recreational activities, community events, and housing initiatives.

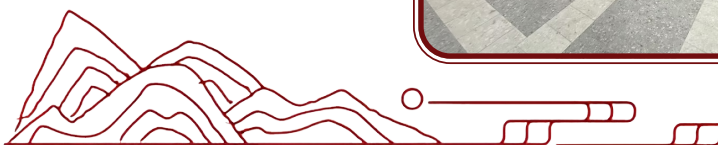
To strengthen operational efficiency and enhance service delivery, the organization undertook significant upgrades to its IT infrastructure and wireless network systems. These improvements were designed to increase reliability, improve data security, and support growing program and administrative demands.

Key enhancements included:

- Upgrading network hardware, including routers, switches, and firewalls
- Expanding high-speed Wi-Fi coverage throughout the facility
- Increasing internet bandwidth to accommodate hybrid programming, livestreaming, and administrative operations
- Implementing enhanced cybersecurity protocols and secure data backup systems
- Modernizing workstations and shared devices to improve staff productivity

As a result of these upgrades, the organization achieved:

- Expanded Wi-Fi coverage
- Improved network speed and reduced service interruptions
- Enhanced data protection and compliance with privacy standards
- Greater capacity to support large-scale events, virtual programming, and digital registration systems
- Increased operational efficiency for staff and volunteers

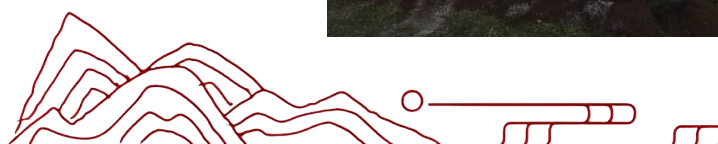

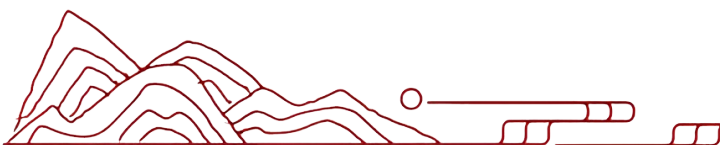
